General Meeting

May 8, 2018

The meeting was called to order shortly after 7pm by outgoing President Peter Grewar. There were 12 people in attendance. There were no directors present due to the Middle School Band Concert scheduled at the same time.

Introduction of Officers in attendance:

President, Peter Grewar. The next general meeting will be in July, but will not be on campus, as the schools are not available on summer evenings. The meeting will most likely be on Tuesday July 10th, and a meeting place will be announced. (Possibly St. Ferdinand Church or the Cranberry Municipal Building.)

Peter also thanked the booster members and executive board members for allowing him to be President of the organization for the last two years and spoke of the transition in July.

As this is her last year, Peter proposed including a gift card, which was approved by all. Pam will pick up the gift card, and Kim Grasso will include a time to present it to Linda at the Band Banquet.

Directors' Report: Again, there were no directors at the meeting, so, no Directors' Report.

UNIFORM FITTINGS—Julie Smith:

Julie, Cheryl and Lori are looking to move uniform fittings to a larger room/location to make the process less stressful and HOT. Ideas were proposed to check on using the cafeteria, the hallway or the gymnasium. Julie will check with Bob Cook.

Also, the uniform team is looking for ways to streamline the refit process for returning marchers and make sure more students are aware that they can request the same uniform if it

still fits them. This will need to be discussed with the directors to see about adapting or replacing the forms the kids fill out at the end of the year.

BAND BANQUET—Kim Grasso:

Plans for the Banquet, which is in less than 2 weeks, are going well. As of the meeting tonight there are 292 people planning to attend, which includes 143 banders and 149 guests. There are 56 seniors in the program and all but 15 have sent an RSVP. Theresa Kane is looking into contacting those 15. Because of the large number of attendees, Kim has been in contact with Philip Lincoln at the Doubletree, and they will be moving us into a larger room! Committees are doing well, there are more people to facilitate sign ins and donations have been good.

PIE FEST—Amy Covell:

Pie Fest will be on Tuesday August 21, 2018. Amy has contacted both elementary Band Teachers, Tracy Glass and Kelly Levere, and will be doing flyers at the summer band programs again this year. Haine's is July 9-19 and Evans City's is July 16-26.

Amy is looking for people to be in charge of the following on the day of the event: pie cutting, stadium, and money tables. She will ask Todd to put that volunteer option on the website. Pam Villegas will do the program again this year. Eleanor Camus, Page Wessel and Theresa Kane volunteered to help.

YEARBOOKS—Elizabeth Blakely:

We needed a minimum of 50 yearbooks ordered to get the discount price and we had 66 ordered. 3 extra were ordered, of which one is already spoken for. Elizabeth and Todd are working on the slide show for the Banquet, and thumb drives have been ordered.
